Run Time

The play runs for about 1 hour and 30 minutes including a 20 minute interval.

Setting

In the early 1960s, single mother Beatrice and her two daughters, Ruth and Tillie Hunsdorfer, live with Nanny in an apartment which was once a vegetable and fruit store in New York. They are trying to cope with their abysmal status in life. Bright but shy Tillie is constantly thwarted by her extroverted and unstable sister and her mother is always trying to stamp out any opportunities Tillie has of succeeding, due to Beatrice's own lack of success in life.

Director's Notes

Beatrice lives in the past where life with her doting father was safe. She also lives in the future where she has plans of fulfilling her dreams. However, she fails to live in the present where both her teenage daughters, Ruth and Tillie, need her understanding and support to navigate their own very different journeys through life.

This play was critically acclaimed and earned several awards, including an Obie Award for best play of the season, 1970, the New York Drama Critics Circle Award for best American play of the year, 1970, and the Pulitzer Prize for drama, 1971. In 1972 Twentieth Century-Fox released a film version starring Joanne Woodward.

She plans to live an extraordinary life and hopes to do all she can whilst pursing her dreams.


