Since premiering in London's West End in 1954, Agatha Christie's comedy-thriller 'Spider's Web' has been capturing audiences around the world. Considered one of Christie's most successful plays, second only to 'The Mousetrap,' it has now made its way to Maitland Repertory Theatre stage!

This is my directorial debut at Maitland Repertory Theatre and I am so thankful for the opportunity. When I put my hand up to direct I thought that this classic, with a cast of 11, might fall to someone more experienced than myself, so I was truly honoured when the committee offered me the chance to work on this fun and 'fantastic' play.

As with all things worth doing, there have been challenges along the way, but I hope that for all blood, sweat, tears and illness that has been endured, you will experience the wonder, intrigue and joy that Christie initially intended for her audiences.

I must take a moment to thank our wonderful construction team, for whom no job is too challenging. Our wonderful backstage and technical crew must also be thanked for their efforts. They are integral to the success of any production and we would be lost without them.

Next, I must thank the incredibly talented and dynamic cast for their patience and dedication throughout the whole process. Each of these actors has poured so much of their time and energy into this production and you are about to witness the delightful result of their hard work. With our youngest actor only 11 years old and our eldest 85 years young, there has been such a range of life experience being shared and expressed during rehearsals. While some have been treading the boards for many years, others are taking their first steps into the spotlight with this production and it has been a delight to witness them exploring, creating, growing, challenging and supporting each other in their time together. Just as the web needs many strands to come together for it to serve its purpose, this cast have banded together to create something beautiful to behold. Scene Two: Ten minutes later.


ACT III A few minutes later.


